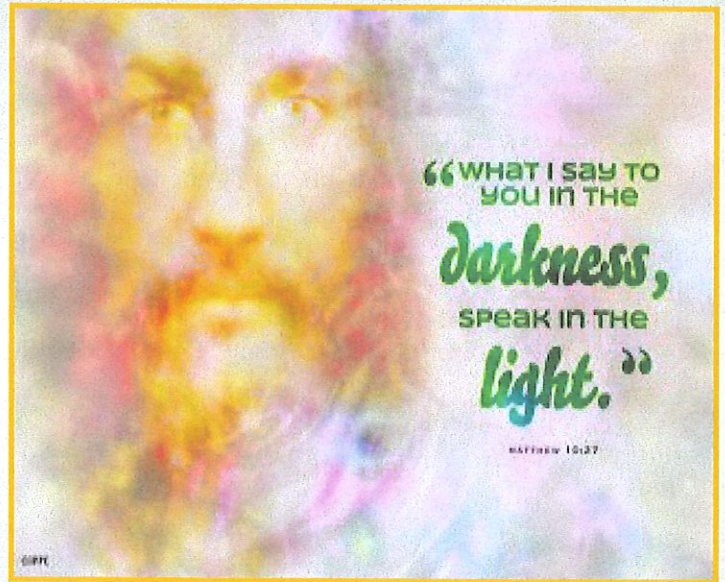

My Dear Parishioners,

Praised Be Jesus Christ! For the first time in four months, we are once again wearing green on a Sunday! Green is the color of Ordinary Time in the Church and in so many ways it's been a long time since we've been in

Ordinary Time! Even now, our times remain extraordinary with things like Covid, Protests, Riots and so much confusion. Nevertheless, the ordinary remains. The waking up each morning and going to bed at night; the 24 hour day and the 7 day week; the sun rising and the sun setting. These ordinary things have not changed and it's good to keep this in mind. For it's only to the extent that we acknowledge the ordinary stuff that we will ever be able to live well.

Saints are those men and women who accept the ordinary stuff and do something with it. They neither curse nor acquiesce to their times; they are not blind or hardened by injustice. They see all things and choose to live a different way. Aware and vulnerable to all the problems, injustice and hate, they live different. And that "different" brought healing and blessing, making even the ordinary extraordinary. I close with a short bio of the first African-American priest and soon to be saint, Fr. Augustus Tolton.

Born in Brush Creek, Missouri in 1854, John Augustus Tolton began life with the odds stacked against him. He began life without his God-given rights of freedom, dignity and equality; he began life not as a human being, but as someone's personal property-as a slave of a white Catholic family. His early childhood coincided with the Civil War; his father, Peter Paul Tolton escaped slavery to join the Union Army while his mother, Martha, remained the maid of her owners. Augustus Tolton was raised in the Roman Catholic Church; his mother was baptized a Catholic because her owners were of the Catholic faith.

Despite adversities, human cruelties and hatred by his fellow man, Augustus Tolton had the love of Jesus Christ in his heart. In 1862, he and his family found the courage to escape slavery by bravely crossing the Mississippi River into Illinois. According to one report, when they reached freedom, Tolton's mother turned to him and said, "John, boy, you're free. Never forget the goodness of the Lord."

Even though racial conflict haunted Tolton most of his life, he remained devoted to service in the Catholic Church. With the blessing of a loving man of God, Fr. Peter McGirr, Tolton was allowed to attend St. Peter's Catholic School, an all-white parish school in Quincy, Illinois. Fr. McGirr and others mentored and tutored him as they began to realize that Tolton was destined to greatness. After Augustus entered St. Peter, Fr. McGirr, who was the school's pastor, baptized him and prepared him for his first Holy Communion. God indeed had a plan for this young black man's life and the will of God would be done.

Augustus Tolton devoted himself to serving God by making his life a living example of God's words. Unfortunately, no American seminary would accept a black man. Without allowing his faith in the Lord to falter, Tolton graduated from high school and Quincy College. In 1880, with Fr. McGirr's continued support, Augustus began his studies for priesthood in Rome.. He was an excellent student because everything he did and all he accomplished were to glorify God.

Augustus Tolton, born a commodity to be bought and sold... owned as a mere piece of property... blazed a trail while following God's calling. He learned to speak fluent English, German, Italian and Latin, Greek and African dialects. He became an accomplished and talented musician with a beautiful voice. For the first time in his life, Augustus experienced racial harmony and total acceptance within the church. By the Grace of God, he finally came to experience the love of his Church, the Catholic Church.

For those who don't know me, my name is Ryan Nguyen and I am a seminarian at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. In today's Gospel, we learn of God's great plan and foreknowledge for each one of us. As Jesus says, "Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge." I wish life has a *pause button* that would enable me to pause every precious moment that God gives me in his foreknowledge. This life is rather short, like a few seconds short when compared to eternity which is a very long time! Sometimes I wake up each morning without much thought to the nature around the rectory: from the rabbits hopping around in the garden to the *sparrows* flapping their wings and ruffling their feathers in the dirt. You see, our heavenly Father in his foreknowledge has a daily plan for me and for you. Bounded by the dimension of time, it's easy to think that today is *just another day*. Time, however, does not exist in God's dimension.

This past Saturday (June 13), I had a great time doing a blessing of the motorcycles for a group of bikers, some of whom are members of St. Patrick. To my delight, the Church has blessings for almost everything: boats, cars, motorcycles, religious objects, etc. The blessing is beautiful—we invoke God's protection to overshadow the bikers and to keep all their paths safe. This blessing reminds me of my own path and why I should set it aside in favor of God's eternal path for me—a path that leads to the love of God and of neighbor. Simply standing among the bikers whom I have just met for the first time, I'm just astounded of being in their path where I feel like I'm spiritually part of the bikers' family. As baptized Christians, we are a family and we belong to the kingdom of God, the Mystical Body of Christ.

Let's not forget that every interaction is a spiritual encounter and a graceful moment to extend the kingdom of God—a kingdom that is not just in heaven but is *here and now* in the present moment. Every encounter is meaningful because ultimately what's at stake is *eternity*. Everything else passes away including "our own path", but the love of God and of neighbor is an eternal path! As St. Therese of Lisieux once wrote, "Love is eternal, reaching down through the ages and stretching to the uttermost limits of earth... Without love, deeds, even the most brilliant, count as nothing."

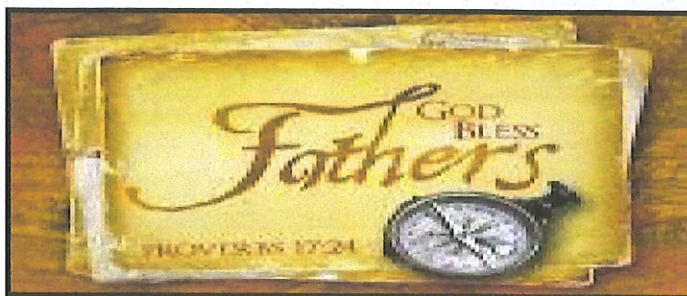

Continued from Pastor's Corner

In 1886, after six years of study in the seminary, Tolton was ordained to the priesthood in Rome at the tender age of 31. He had expected to serve in an African parish; surprisingly, he was directed to return to the United States to serve the black community. Fr. Augustus Tolton became the first Black American priest in the United States of America! Born as a slave in America, he became an American hero! For a brief moment in history, racial differences that only ran skin deep were forgotten because of this great man of God. Tolton held his first public Mass at St. Boniface Church in Quincy, Illinois and eventually he became pastor of St. Joseph Catholic Church and school.

Racial tension in Quincy still ran rampant and Father Tolton accepted a reassignment to Chicago in order to fulfill his calling to serve God. He gave service by helping the poor and sick, feeding the hungry and winning souls for God. His endless, tireless and devoted work led many to the Faith. In 1897, the first black Catholic priest in America, lovingly known as "Good Father Gus," died unexpectedly while on a priest's retreat. Tolton was only 43 years old, yet he left a legacy that will live forevermore. He was called to God, but not chosen by the world. He refused to allow himself to be deterred from the path that had been mapped out for him by God...a path not yet well-worn.

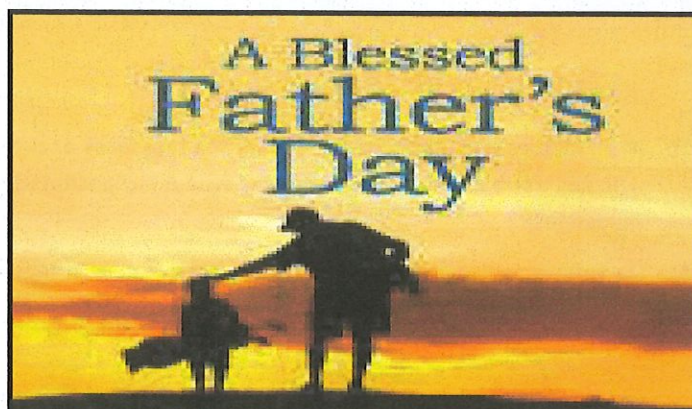

PLEASE TAKE NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS AS WE ENTER THE YELLOW PHASE OF PENNSYLVANIA'S RE-OPENING PROCESS. THIS PHASE ALLOWS THE RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC WORSHIP FOR GROUPS GREATER THAN 10 PERSONS. IN LIGHT OF THIS STATE DECISION, ARCHBISHOP PEREZ HAS GRANTED PERMISSION FOR PUBLIC MASS TO BE CELEBRATED ONCE AGAIN IN CHURCHES THROUGHOUT THE ARCHDIOCESE ACCORDING TO THE NORMS SET FORTH BY THE CDC.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

1. The faithful are NOT required to attend Mass at this time. The Sunday Obligation lifted by Archbishop Perez in March remains in place.
2. If you are sick, have a fever, are at higher risk of severe illness, live with or care for those who are at higher risk, you have a duty to remain home.
3. The 9AM Mass will be livestreamed each Sunday from our Church. ***Please note the time change***
4. ALL who choose to come to Mass in this YELLOW PHASE are required to follow the guidelines set forth and listed on our COMING TO MASS PAGE WHICH CAN BE FOUND ON THE HOME PAGE OF OUR WEBSITE.
5. Church will continue to be open Monday thru Saturday for private visits till 3PM.
6. Sunday Mass Schedule will be as follows: 5PM Saturday Vigil Mass and Sunday at 7:30AM, 9:00AM, 10:30AM and Noon. *** Registration to make a reservation for the weekend of June 13-14 will open Sunday, June 7 at 12:00PM and will continue thru Thursday, June 11 until 5:00PM.*** Visit the website to make a reservation for Sunday Mass.
7. Weekday Mass Schedule will be as follows: 7:30AM Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday
7:00PM Monday, Wednesday ***NO 7:30AM MASS ON WEDNESDAY MORNING***
8:00AM Saturday
NO RESERVATIONS ARE NEEDED FOR DAILY MASS
8. Confessions will be heard from 3:30PM to 4:30PM in the School Meeting Room. Weddings, Funerals and Baptisms will continue to be celebrated via the parish office.
9. Attendance at Sunday Mass REQUIRES a reservation. Sign up via our parish website or call Jen Keller at the Parish Office at 610-444-4364.
10. At all Masses one must provide and wear a face mask or cloth covering. Exceptions are "children younger than 2 years old, anyone who has trouble breathing and anyone who is incapacitated or unable to remove the cloth face covering without assistance." (CDC Guidelines).
11. On Sunday, arrive at Church 15 minutes prior to your scheduled Mass.
12. Hand sanitizers will be available in the back of Church; it is recommended that you bring your own.

Baptism: celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month. Please call the parish office to schedule.

Matrimony: celebrated throughout the year. Please contact Fr. Rogers.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Registration is held on the First Sunday of Each Month or at the parish office. Roman Catholics who live within the boundaries of the parish should register in the parish. This will regularize one's status and allow for the issuance of certificates and make possible the arrangements for Baptism, Weddings and Confirmations.
