  - c) Thursday, December 9: A mid-Morning retreat with Randy Kraft.
- 3) **Confession:** Receive the Sacrament of God's Divine Mercy this Advent. See schedule below.
- 4) **Christmas Giving Tree:** Express Charity for others. Numerous groups that could benefit from your charity.
- 5) Finally, join us for our **Parish Christmas Tree Lighting and the Joyful Scenes of Christmas** with our young people. Sunday, December 12, 4PM.
