Praised be Jesus Christ! This Sunday, October 4 marks the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. By most accounts, Francis is one of the most universally celebrated of saints. Yet, at the same time he is so little known. Often relegated to gardens and bird baths, the truth is that Francis was a radical reformer, a stigmatic, a Christ-marked man. His story is worth

knowing and ignorance of it does serious harm to those who celebrate him. The same can be said of almost anything. Ignorance is fertile ground for abuse especially by those in authority. This brings me to an important item of our day: Religious Freedom.

Some define freedom of religion as the mere freedom of worship. Thus, relegating faith and religion to the confines of a church, a mosque, a temple. (Like Francis in the birdbath.) But our Founding Fathers, Constitution and certainly our Church have a much wider view. Religious freedom is the freedom to live one’s faith in every aspect of life, both in and out of Church, while always respecting the freedom of others. (Like Francis on the streets of Assisi). Religious Freedom enables so many wonderful things and the absence of that freedom creates so much harm.

I close with a listing of some of the many blessings that our Catholic Christian Faith has been to the world beyond Church and from Church. And ask that among all the important issues on the ballot, you remember the importance of religious freedom.
