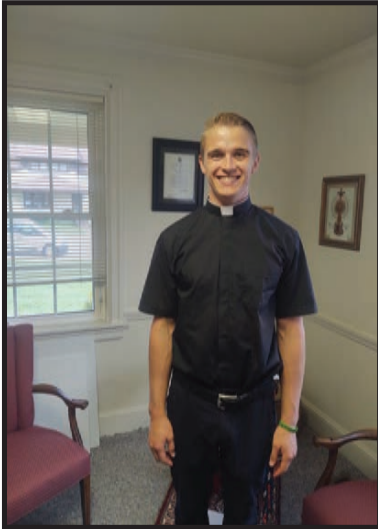


ANNOUNCING AUGUSTINE



Hi! My name is Augustine Reimers, and I am a seminarian from the Diocese of Lincoln, Nebraska and study at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. I'm looking forward to being at St. Patrick's every Thursday throughout the school year. I am very excited for the time I will get to spend with you. I grew up in Seward, Nebraska, which is a small town about 25 miles west of Lincoln. I attended St. Gregory the Great Seminary in Seward before coming to St. Charles two years ago. I am the third of five children. I grew up in a very Catholic home, my siblings and I all went to Catholic school from kindergarten through our senior year of high school. It was because of my time around priests in school and at Mass on Sunday that I first began to think about the priesthood. It wasn't until the end of my junior year of high school that I began to seriously consider whether God was calling me to be a priest. Half-way through my senior year I discerned that God was calling me to the seminary. I entered the seminary after graduating from high school. I spent four years at the college seminary in the Diocese of Lincoln, I am beginning my third year of theology at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. This coming May I will be ordained a deacon.
